### Report on the 2015 ECPR Executive Committee Election Results

From 15 October 2014 to 15 February 2015, The European Consortium for Political Research conducted a three-stage process to elect new members to the organization's Executive Committee.

The elections were carried out on the basis of the document "2015 Elections to the ECPR Executive Committee", approved by the Executive Committee on 6 September 2014, updating the "Rules for Electing Members of the ECPR Executive Committee" approved by the Executive Committee on 31 August 2010". The elections were carried out electronically using a special platform created on the ECPR website. Following the new Constitutional provision 13d, the Speaker of the ECPR Council, Prof. David Farrell, served as Senior Returning Officer to ensure proper oversight of the election.

The election was to fill 7 seats on the 12-member Executive Committee. Five vacancies were caused by members having served their full statutory term of office (Professors Simona Piattoni, Niilo Kauppi, Jonas Talberg, Manuel Sanchez de Dios and André Kaiser). In addition, two members elected in 2012, Professors Pippa Norris and Knud-Erik Jorgensen, had stepped down, meaning that two new members (Professors Birgit Sauer and Mary Farrell) needed to be coopted. Under clause 14f of the ECPR Constitution, individuals appointed in such a manner may hold the seat only until the next Executive Committee election.

The first phase of the election – candidate nominations – took place from 15 October to 15 November. At the conclusion of this period, 18 nominations were received in the following order:

Three nominees (Galit Eizman, Peter Ozonyia, and Alberto Spektorowski) were not affiliated to an ECPR full-member institution, and their names were not forwarded to the endorsement stage, leaving 15 duly nominated candidates.

The second phase of the election – endorsements – took place from 1 December 2014 to 1 January 2015. All Official Representatives of full-member institutions were asked to endorse nominees for the final electoral ballot. The endorsement stage of the procedure for electing a new Executive Committee closed on January 1. One candidate, Karin Bäckstrand, withdrew her nomination on December 1 2014, only hours after the beginning of the endorsement period. Her name was deleted from the endorsement page that same day.

At the conclusion of the endorsement period, 12 candidates had received the required number of endorsements to be carried onto the ballot:

The full results of the endorsement phase are presented in Appendix 2.

The final voting phase took place from January 15 to February 15. A total of 155 ballots (out of a total number of 300 Official Representatives with the right to vote) were cast. All of the votes were declared valid. The votes (as recorded on the ECPR website) were uploaded into the programme OpenSTV (see <a href="https://www.openstv.org">www.openstv.org</a>) and processed according to the Scottish variant of STV.

In accordance with Clause 14f of the Constitution, Professors Sauer and Farrell are elected for a three-year term, as they are already serving on the Executive Committee as coopted members. All other candidates will serve a six year term.

The full calculation of results is presented in Appendix 3.

At all three stages of the election, the results were certified by the Speaker of the ECPR Council, Prof. David Farrell, as correct.

#### Appendix 1

### Election rules, as published in "the 2015 elections to the ECPR Executive Committee"

- 1. The elections are conducted electronically and consist of three stages:
  - a. Nominations
  - b. Endorsements
  - c. Final voting.

All three stages are carried out under the supervision of the Speaker of the ECPR Council in his/her capacity as Senior Returning Officer, unless the Speaker nominates himself/herself. In that case the outgoing Chair of the Executive Committee appoints another Senior Returning Officer.

Each of the three stages is announced at least one week in advance of the starting date on the ECPR website, and by email to all Official Representatives of full-member institutions.

- 2. Eligibility: Candidates need not be Official Representatives. The only restriction is that, according to the Constitution (14b), candidates should belong to a full-member institution at the time of their election. At the 2012 elections, the Senior Returning Officer ruled that art 8 of the Constitution (stipulating that full-members which are more than one year in arrears with their subscription cease to be eligible on the Council) should also apply for candidates to the Executive Committee. This implies that at the time of his/her election a candidate should belong to a full-member institution that has paid its subscription for the 2013/2014 membership year. As the election consists of two phases (acquiring sufficient endorsements and acquiring sufficient votes), 'at the time of their election' is operationalised as 'by the start of the endorsement period, i.e. December 1, 2014.
- 3. **Voting and endorsing rights**: Also following Art 8 of the Constitution, only Official Representatives of full-member institutions which have paid their subscription for the 2013/2014 membership year by the start of the endorsement period (December 1, 2014) can endorse candidates and vote.
- 4. Nominations. From October 15 to November 15, 2014, candidates can post their nomination on the ECPR website. Nominations must come from the candidates themselves. When posting his or her name, the nominee will be allowed to add a portrait photo and a statement of up to 500 words, covering basic biographical information, the motivation for standing for election, and any pre-endorsements by Standing Groups, Research Networks, etc. Nominees shall be listed in the order in which they posted their nomination on the website.
- 5. **Endorsements.** From December 1, 2014 to January 1, 2015, all Official Representatives of full member institutions (See art.3) are invited to endorse up to three candidates for the final ballot. For inclusion on the final ballot, a nominee must:
  - i. Receive at least 5 endorsements,
  - ii. Have endorsements from Official Representatives of full-member institutions in at least 2 countries,
  - iii. Have endorsements from Official Representatives of full-member institutions of both sexes.

Endorsements are public. Endorsements to all candidates are possible throughout the endorsement period (i.e. it remains possible to endorse a candidate who has already met the criteria set out above).

6. If at the conclusion of either the nomination or endorsement periods there is an insufficient number of candidates, the Senior Returning Officer shall have the right to extend the period for nomination and/or endorsement, and to postpone the voting period, in order to ensure that

enough candidates are on the ballot. Nominees or candidates may also withdraw their names until the closing of the endorsement period (i.e. January 1, 2015) by sending a message to the Senior Returning Officer c/o ECPR Central Services.

- 7. **Final Voting.** Once the final ballot of candidates has been determined, all Official Representatives of full member institutions (See art.3) will be asked to vote for their preferred candidates. The voting period is from January 15 to February 15, 2015. The electoral system to be used is Single Transferable Vote (Scottish variant). Official Representatives will be asked to rank order their preferred candidates. The minimum number of candidates to be rankordered for a vote to be valid is one. There is no maximum to the number of candidates to be rank ordered. Pursuant to the STV method, preference votes will be tallied and transferred until all vacancies are either filled or until preferences are exhausted (at which point any remaining vacancies will be awarded to those candidates with the highest vote tallies).
- 8. Candidates are declared elected as soon as the Senior Returning Officer has certified the results. Following certification, all candidates are informed of the results by the Senior Returning Officer. If the results are not challenged within a week of the candidates having been informed, they are final and are made public on the ECPR website within a week of having become final. Elected candidates take office at the end of the Joint Sessions of Workshops in Warsaw (April 2, 2015).
- 9. When insufficient candidates are declared elected to fill all vacancies on the Executive Committee, the Executive Committee shall fill such vacancies by co-option.
