

Migration and Electoral Politics in Europe and Beyond

Abstract

This panel discusses the evolution of policies and practices of immigrant political engagement over time and across countries. We explore the topic of migrants' political integration from a transnational perspective, by focusing mainly on how and when migrants engage in the political arena and which specific institutional, societal, political, or individual factors condition their electoral involvement. We invite proposals examining the voting behaviour of migrants in home and host country elections, the diversification of non-electoral forms of political engagement, and patterns of minority representation in parliamentary assemblies at the national, sub-national, or supranational level.

To submit a proposal, you will need to provide:

- your name, academic affiliation and email address
- a title for your paper
- an abstract of up to 500 words.
