Abstract

In recent years, policy process research has experienced the emergence of theoretical perspectives on policy change that either connect to existing and established frameworks or provide a complementary view on the policy process. This panel seeks to foster intellectual discussion with regard to emerging perspectives, such as the Policy Conflict Framework (PCF, Weible and Heikkila 2017), Identity Politics (Béland 2017), Social Identities in the Policy Process (SIPP, Hornung *et al.* 2018), Actor-Centered Constructivism (Saurugger 2013), and the Programmatic Action Framework PAF, Hassenteufel *et al.* 2010; Hornung and Bandelow 2018). The panel is open to all methodological and theoretical innovations that provide new insights for the explanation of policies and the policy process (Schlager and Weible 2013).
