The Congress program will be prepared by Program Co-Chairs Irasema Coronado (Arizona State University) and Azul A. Aguiar-Aguilar (Jesuit University of Guadalajara) under the theme *Resisting Autocratization in Polarized Societies*.

The vibrant city of Seoul, with its population of 10 million, is South Korea's economic, cultural, and political capital. The IPSA World Congress will be organized in collaboration with the Korean Political Science Association (KPSA), and we expect a strong turnout from the political science communities of Asia and Oceania. 
